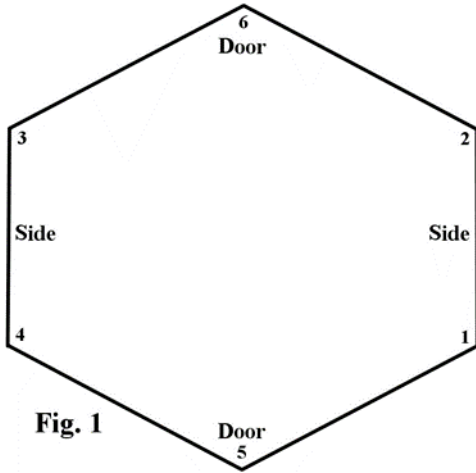


## Setup Instructions for Lunar Duo

Choose a campsite away from low hanging branches, and clear the ground of sharp objects such as sticks or rocks. Choose a site where water will **drain away** from the shelter. Avoid contact of the tent's floor with sharp or abrasive objects. The use of a footprint is recommended. Six Moon Designs offers Tyvek or Polycro footprints in various sizes.



1. Lay out your **Lunar Duo** as desired. In windy conditions place either side into the wind.\*
2. Extend all corner guy-outs to their maximum length.
3. Stake out side corners 1 & 2 (Fig. 1).
4. Stake out corners 3 & 4 (Fig. 1), leave some slack so that the canopy can rise when you set your poles.
5. Insert the curved spreader bar into the pocket located in the interior roof above the door. Start from the elastic tab end.
6. Set pole length to **45" (114 cm)**.
7. Under the vestibule, insert tip of pole into grommet at the top of one door, then place handle or end of pole on ground.
8. With the guy line under the vestibule, pull taut and stake. Use line lock at apex to adjust tension. (Fig. 1 Door 5 & 6).
9. Attach the webbing loop at the bottom end of the vestibule to the hook that slides along the front guy line to secure the vestibule. Tension, as needed, by sliding hook down guy line.
10. Repeat for the second door.
11. Adjust the tension of the canopy as needed.

### Notes:

- Allow a half hour for the material to relax then re-tension as needed.
- \*For increased stability in extremely windy conditions, attach guy lines (not included) to any of the six side tie-out loops and stake out or tie off to vegetation.
